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Bubble Notes or "**Instructional notes**" are typically created by a teacher to provide students with additional instructional support.

Bubble notes can contain comments, directions for a task, or questions in a variety of formats to assess comprehension. They help to truly make the textbook *dynamic* and *interactive*.

Answers to Bubble Notes can be collected and reviewed.

After students answer the bubble note questions, answers to the questions can be retrieved by using the "**extract annotations**" feature. Similar to extracting highlights, this automatically creates a separate file of Bubble Notes that can be saved and/or printed.




Walk-Through with Instructor – Adding Bubble Notes for Instructional Support


Follow these steps to insert bubble notes to support reading comprehension.


- 1. Open Time Travel.kes if not already open.
 - a. Make sure the reading unit is **Sentence** and reading mode is **Continuous**.
 - b. Then go to page1 and the Time and Speed heading.
 - c. Click at the beginning of the first sentence to position the cursor.
- 2. Select **Tools/Note/Add Bubble Note**. Or click on **Bubble Note** button on your toolbar.



- 3. Type "Time travel is only for the future." in the Keyword Text Box.
 - a. Under Appearance, select Cloud and Small.
 - b. Under Open Options, check Open while reading and Open after unit is read. This will automatically open the note after the sentence is read.
 - i. Note: "open when word is read" will pop the note open instantly.
 - c. Under Reading Options, select "Read note on open".
 - d. Under Question Options, select the **True or False** radio button.
- 4. Select Preview.
 - a. Select **OK** in the note preview to close preview mode.
 - b. Make changes if needed.
 - c. If your note previews correctly, select **OK** to exit the dialog. Or try adding additional types of bubble notes.
- 5. Read the sentence, "Time travel is not only for the future."
- 6. The Bubble Note will automatically appear and read at the end of the sentence.
- 7. To see answers: <u>File/Extract Notes</u> and Highlights/select Notes/Bubble notes.
- A new text (.rtf) file will be created with just the answers to the Bubble Note questions.
